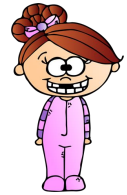
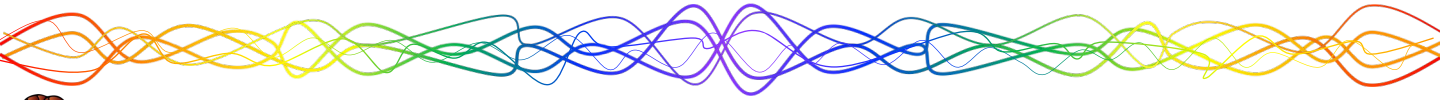


Why is it important to recycle?

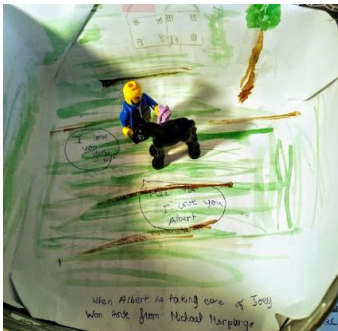
