The Arctic Fox by: Keegan DELPLACE

Have you seen a cute Arctic Fox that can live in the very cold environment? Well these animals are one my favourite animals in the world. Let me introduce them!

They are mammals which means they are warm blooded vertebrate animals who have fur or hair and the females secrete milk for their babies. They live for 3–6 years, so unfortunately they don't live for long.

The Arctic Foxes have special features and adapt very well to the extreme frigid temperature as low as -70°C. They have thick white fur, fluffy tail, small eyes, ears, nose and short legs for protection against the cold. Their weight is l-3.2 kg, their height is 45-70 cm and their tail can grow up to 35 cm. They use their thick white fur to camouflage themselves among the ice and snow. In summer their fur colour changes to brownish or greyish to camouflage among the plants and rocks.

They are omnivore so they eat small rodents called lemmings and also plants. Sometimes it will follow a polar bear on a hunting trip and eats it's leftovers. They live in snow or rock plies burrows with extensive tunnel system in the very icy cold environment called the Arctic Circle.

The Arctic Foxes are endangered animals and their extinction is impacted by the climate change where the ice melts more and more than it used to due to the heat. Also they are often hunted because of the fur trade and the oil could spill on the ice because of the oil and gas companies.

The Arctic Foxes are among the most beautiful animals because of their unique features. We need to protect them from the extinction!

All about hamsters



1/ Introduction

Do you know that the word hamster comes from the word hamstern in German, which means hoard in English? Hoard means to keep food in his cheeks.

2/ Background

Hamsters are rodents from the subfamily *Cricetinae*; they belong to mammal's family. There are 25 species of hamsters. Hamsters can live up to 2 to 3 years if you take good care of them. They can live in the wild, but are also wonderful pets!



3/ Characteristics

Hamsters are typically stout bodied, with tails shorter than their body length and have two small furry ears, four short feet. They have thick silky fur. Hamsters range in size from the largest breed, the European hamster at 34 cm long, to the smallest, the dwarf hamster at 5.5 - 10.5 cm long. The most common hamster's weight is between 20g to 150g. Depending on the species hamsters can be black, grey, honey, white, brown, yellow, red, or a combination of these colors.

4/ Diet/Habitat

Hamsters like to eat: seeds, grains, fruits and vegetables. They like to live in warm, dry areas. We can find them everywhere in the world. When hamsters live in the wild, they find food in nature and keep it in their food storage, in their burrow.


5/Adaptations

Hamsters have strong paws to dig through the ground. They have burrows underground

like rabbits. Wild hamsters live in warm desert areas and sand dunes. Their fur protects them. Hamsters do not have good eyesight; they are nearsighted and also colour-blind.

The enemies of hamsters are birds of prey, wild cats, owls, canids, snakes, weasels, storks, jackals. Hamsters can eat: rats, mice, insects, frogs and lizards. One surprising fact about hamsters is that they are nocturnal, like owls - this means they stay awake at night and sleep during the day.




7/Impact of cross breeding or extinction info



Now I will tell you about their eating habits. Like all wild cats pumas are carnivores which means they eat meat. Pumas stalk and ambush their prey. This means they surprise the animal they are going to kill. Their main diet is animals such as deer, elk, cattle and sheep. Basically, the puma will eat any animal it can catch, even animals as large as a moose. These are the key facts about their diet.

Where do pumas like to live? They can be found in the mountains of North and South America. They live by seas, rocky areas but also in tropical forests, swamps and deserts. They avoid areas where people live. Unfortunately they are losing their land because humans are building everywhere. Luckily they are adaptable so they will not die out. Pumas can become aggressive when other animals go into their home.

I watched a video about the life of pumas and I learnt lots of things: Males actually protect females and in return females have their babies. Pumas like to hunt together and eat together too. Even when they are aggressive when they first meet they become friendly afterwards. This means that they are quite sociable animals.

They swim by wagging their tails. When they dive 7 meters deep or more, they stay submerged for at least 30 minutes but Iguanas can go underwater for up to I hour without breathing.


Eagles

Eagles can live up to twenty years. This bird of prey can go up to very high speeds. This fantastic bird can go up to a hundred and fifty kilometres per hour. A car can't go faster than that! This great bird is 75 to 88 cm long and two meters twenty centimetres large when it has its wings open. Its feather are a dark colour and I imagine it's to camouflage itself. 
Now I will show you the relations between sharks and humans. First, let's see how sharks can kill humans. In figure I, we notice that the USA is the place where there

All sharks are not great white sharks. There are so many different species in the world. A shark is a fish. They live between 10 and 40 years depending on the 300 species. Sharks have inhabited planet Earth for approximately 400 millions years. Nearly one third of sharks species worldwide are endangered. A Shark can be red, blue, grey or white. Their teeth are constantly replaced during their lives. They can regrow as much as 30 000 teeth.



I will now show you key facts about sharks. The Greenland shark can live more than 272 years. The smallest shark on Earth is the small-spotted cat shark. He is less than I kg and less than I meter. Introduction

I would like to tell you about wolves because the wolf is my favourite animal.

Background

Wolves are mammals.

They belong to the family of canines (canus lupus) and are considered as wild dogs.

They can live up to 15 years.

Characteristics

Wolves are the largest extant member of canidae. Males weigh 40kg on average and females 37kg. Wolves measure 105 to 200 cm.

Wolves live in groups called packs. There can be between two and twenty wolves in a pack. Wolves from a pack are usually from the same family. A big male and a big female lead the pack: they are often the parents of the others.

The whole pack hunts together. Wolves prey is varied: hares, elks, deers, bisons, mooses, beavers...

Wolves live in grasslands, forests, in the mountains or in the desert.

The Arctic wolf lives in one of the coldest parts of the world.

Adaptations

Wolves have long and powerful legs to help them to run. They have big and strong paws that they use for hunting and digging. Their fur is fantastic: it is long for wolves that live in cold places and short for the ones that live in the desert; it is also longer in Winter than in Summer. The Arctic wolf has got a white fur that makes it hard to spot.



Jaw-Dropping Facts

A wolf can walk up to $80 \mathrm{kms}$ within a day.

The wolf fangs are 4cm long.

Wolves show where they live by marking the area with piles of smelly dung.

Wolves don't only eat meat: they also like eating berries!

A mother wolf has around six babies at a time: they are called wolf cubs.

Baby wolves have blue eyes that turn brown, green or orange later.

Wolves in a pack often together to scare other packs or after having hunted.

Extinction Info

Until 1992, there were no more wolves in France. Then some came from Italy and they multiplied. Since 2004, hunting certain wolves and in certain conditions is allowed. There are only about 150 wolves nowadays in France... but there are much more in Spain: about 2,500!

Conclusion

Both loved and hated, the wolf is a very special animal that has fascinated humans for centuries. It is no wonder that wolves are great characters, that play very important roles in many popular stories.

Despite most of them admiring the illustrations we were all left questioning the ending: what had actually happened to Tristan? Has he gone into the world of the viewer which he found?

"Tristan is trapped in the darkness of the box viewing all the horrible disasters he sees." "Yes I kind of like the book because at each new sentence and word the suspense is there. But at the same time it is kind of sad. The images are well drawn, but sad and violent there are dark colours."

"Tristan went to the first era, which is the worst!"






