Six of this year's graduates will pursue higher education in England: Dauphine London–PSL (economics and management), Derby (international relations and diplomacy), Exeter (law), Glasgow (mechanical engineering), Portsmouth (biology), and Southampton (English language and linguistics).

For those studying in France, four will be doing prépas in the Paris area: Lycée Hoche (MP2I), Lycée Jeanne d'Albret (MPSI), Lycée Lakanal (BL) and Lycée Sainte Geneviève (MPSI). One SI graduate will be studying engineering at the University of Technology at Campiègne. Two will pursue business studies at ESCP and ESSEC; one will pursue medicine at Université de Paris Saclay Mineure. On the artistic side, one student will be attending both ESRA (Ecole supérieure de réalisation audiovisuelle) and Cours Florent.

We look forward to following the next adventures of the Class of 2021!

Meet Joanne Patel





A Taste of Home Brownies and Blondies

Brownies

4 oz. (200 g) dark chocolate

1 cup (226 g) butter

4 eggs

2 cups (405 g) sugar

1 tsp vanilla extract

½ cup (66 g) all-purpose flour

2/3 cup (83 g) chopped walnuts (optional)



- 1. Grease and flour a 9 × 12-inch baking pan.
- 2. Preheat the oven to 350°F (180°C).
- 3. Melt the chocolate and butter together and set aside to cool.
- 4. Cream the eggs and sugar until the mixture thickens and turns a creamy yellow color. Add the vanilla.
- 5. Fold the melted chocolate mixture into the beaten egg mixture, then gently fold the flour into the batter. Add the walnuts if using.
- 6. Bake for 25 minutes or until centre is just set. Do not overbake.
- 7. Allow brownies to cool completely before cutting into bars. Enjoy!



Blondies*

(or Chocolate Chip Cookies**)

1 cup (226 g) butter, softened

¾ cup sugar

¾ cup packed brown sugar

1 tsp vanilla extract

2 eggs


21/4 cups flour

1 tsp baking soda

1 tsp salt

2 cups (200 g) chocolate chips (dark or milk chocolate or a combination of the two)

1 cup (115 g) chopped nuts (optional)




2. Add the eggs. Gradually beat in the flour, baking soda and salt, then stir in chocolate chips (and nuts, if using).

*Blondie version: Transfer batter to a 15 × 10-inch greased and floured baking pan. Bake in preheated oven at 375°F (190°C) for 20–25 minutes or until golden brown. Do not overbake. Enjoy!

**Cookie version: Drop rounded tablespoons of cookie dough onto ungreased baking sheets. Bake in preheated oven at 375°F (190°C) for 9–11 minutes. Recipe makes 5 dozen cookies. Enjoy!

Chef's tip:

You can replace the white and brown sugar called for in the above recipe with 1½ cups sucre roux pure canne.
